## **1.0 INTRODUCTION**

### **1.1 PURPOSE OF THE REPORT**

The purpose of this report is to

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## PRESIDENT BUHARI ATTENDS 26TH CHOGM HELD IN KIGALI



Leaders of 54 countries of the Commonwealth member states including Presidents, Prime Ministers and their representatives from across Africa, Asia, the Caribbean, the Pacific and Europe recently assembled in Kigali, Rwanda for the 26th Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM). The meeting was held for the first time in four years due to COVID-19 pandemic. The leaders discussed ways to strengthen relations and tackle global problems ranging from health care and conflict to climate change and food security. Discussions also covered issues related to democracy, peace, governance, sustainable and inclusive development, and post-COVID 19 recovery. The theme of the meeting was 'Delivering a Common Future: Connecting, Innovating, Transforming'. The Commonwealth is a club of 54 countries the most of which are former British colonies and presents itself as a network of equal partners with shared goals such as democracy, peace and prosperity. The Prince of Wales, Prince Charles, represented Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II as Head of the Commonwealth at the meeting. The gathering had four days of Commonwealth forums on youth, women, business and civil society, high profile side events and preparatory ministerial meetings. Before CHOGM 2022 ran its course, heads of state or their representatives met in executive sessions as well as in leader's retreat. The dignitaries discussed shared priorities that will shape the work programmes of the organisation. Before departing Kigali, President Muhammadu Buhari met with various leaders and Nigerians living in Rwanda.

## Cocoa Farmers Applaud Distribution Of Free Seedlings In Cross River

Cocoa farmers in Cross River State have applauded the free distribution of one hundred thousand improved variety seedlings to encourage young people to embrace farming. The farmers, who were at the flag off ceremony held in Calabar, the capital of Cross River State, south-south Nigeria for the distribution of the seedlings, said that receiving free seedlings from the nursery would enable them utilize their funds to purchase other inputs. The cocoa seedlings were grown in the Cross River State Government owned nursery in Calabar to encourage new and young

farmers from the southern senatorial district to establish farms across the seven local government areas.

One of the farmers present at the event, Mr Akpanke William said "it is a privilege for me to be part of this. We never expected that we will get cocoa seedlings free like this in Cross River. The governor, Professor Ben Ayade has created an opportunity for people like us to grow in farming."

Another farmer, Mr. Maxwell Ebam said, "I have a farm in the central district, but I am one of those trying to propagate the growing of cocoa in the south. Today I am enlightened on the fertile nature of the soil in

the south. The ground is ready for cocoa production. "For those of us from Ikom, Etung and Boki in the central, cocoa is the main stay of our economy. Young people here in the south should see cocoa as a wealth creator. Everything we have in Ikom is from the proceeds of cocoa and with cocoa here it is enough to put us into greater economic height," he stated. A representative of the Cross River State deputy governor, the Commissioner for Finance, Mr. Asuquo Ekpenyong spoke of the importance of cocoa as a cash crop with the propensity to transform economies of young farmers.

Governor Samuel Ortom of Benue State has flagged off the 2022 cropping season with the distribution of improved seeds to rural farmers in the 23 local governments areas of the state.

Ortom, during the ceremony at the premises of the Bureau of Local Government and Chieftaincy Affairs (BLGCA) in Makurdi, at the weekend, directed the council chairmen to ensure that the improved seeds are given to genuine farmers for onward

cultivation in this year's farming season.

The seeds for distribution include 6,900 bags of rice, 833 bags of maize, 1,000 tins of watermelon seeds, 333 bags of sorghum and 11,000 bundles of cassava stems.

The governor commended the Bureau's Special Adviser, Barrister Kenneth Achabo, for initiating and sustaining the agricultural programme, noting that he was impressed with the results achieved in two years.

He emphasized the need

for the people of the state to key into the programme, maintaining that it has added economic value towards boosting the agriculture sub-sector for food security.

Ortom further explained that with two private investors in Makurdi and Ukum as off-takers in cassava processing as its major raw material, the product was already in short supply, calling on the people to engage in profitable agriculture.

He also directed Achabo to liaise with the agriculture departments of local governments to organize a seminar for farmers on best modes of cultivation of the improved seeds to produce the needed result.

Earlier, Achabo had lauded Governor Ortom for the premium he has placed on agriculture and his exploits in transforming the rural sector just as he appealed to the local government chairmen to ensure that the seeds are put to proper use.

## **1.0 INTRODUCTION**

### **1.1 WORKS DESCRIPTION**






##### **4.1 CONCLUSION**

## **1.0 INTRODUCTION**

The Federal Government of Nigeria (FGN) and the International Development Agency (IDA) of the World Bank (WB) entered into a credit agreement (Credit Number 6510NG) to finance the ACE Impact project. To implement the project, the Government of Nigeria has secured a grant, with a contribution from World Bank and the French Development Agency (AFD).

The Africa Centre of Excellence for Mycotoxin and Food Safety (ACEMFS) has an approval to use part of the grant for the construction of its building as detailed by the drawings and described in the Bill of Quantities.

### **1.1 WORKS DESCRIPTION**

The work entails the construction of a two storey building for the Africa Centre of Excellence for Mycotoxin and Food Safety (ACEMFS). This comprising of offices, Laboratories, Conference Rooms, Lecture Rooms, and Conveniences.

The construction basically consists of reinforced concrete columns and beams, ground floor slab, external walls, non-load bearing internal partitions using hollow sandcrete blocks and long span aluminium roofing sheet on structural steel roof members.

### **1.2 THE SITE**

The Site for the project is located within the Main Campus of the University on a plain land.

### **1.3 PURPOSE OF THE REPORT**

The purpose of this report is to

- i. Intimate the University Management and the ACEMFS with the results of the examination and analysis conducted on the tenders
- ii To recommend the most suitable and favourable bid which has satisfied the criteria for the award
- iii. To recommend favourable conditions necessary for the successful construction and completion of the project within recommended tender sum and construction period

### **1.4. TENDERING PROCEDURE**

Five contractors met the technical bidding requirements and as such their financial biddings were approved for further consideration. The contractors are:

1. Mahadi Services and Resources
2. Yukas and Sons Ventures
3. Green Shed Nig. Ltd
4. Plenum Space Ltd
5. Tripple Bullet Services Nig. Ltd



## **2.0 FINANCIAL BIDS**

### **2.1. OPENING OF FINANCIAL BIDS.**

The five contractors whose Technical bids were considered submitted their financial tenders. The tenders were opened on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> August, 2022 at the Senate Chamber at about 2.30 pm (as adjusted) in the presence of Procurement Planning Committee members, the contractors and the representative of the NGO and the Professional Bodies Association.

The tender figures as well as the completion time quoted by the contractors are contained in table 1 below.

### **2.2 RESERVED PRICE**

The reserved price is in the sum of Three Hundred and Twenty Eight Million, Eight Hundred and Sixty Three Thousand, Two Hundred and Four Naira, Seventy Five kobo (N 328,863,204:75k) only and the completion period of 42 weeks as at the time of bid opening.

#### **4.0 CRITERIA FOR THE AWARD OF CONTRACT**

Having passed the prequalification exercise, it can reasonably be assumed that the Contractors:

- (1) Possesses the following adequately to execute the project.
  - a. Financial Resources
  - b. Human and Material Resources
  - c. Satisfy the statutory requirements.
- (2) All contractors have creditable similar jobs previously. However, for this Project to be executed successfully; a contractor will have to satisfy under mentioned criteria upon which our observations are found;
  - i. Reasonable tender sum in comparison with reserved price
  - ii. Realistic completion period.
  - iii. Level of pricing/pricing policy revealing reasonableness and consistency of the unit rates used in the tender sum.
  - iv. Genuine basic price of materials and labour rates.

#### **4.1. OBSERVATIONS AND COMMENTS ON TENDERS**

The following objective observations were used based on the tables 1, 2, 3, 4 & 5 in terms of the deviation of the tender sum from the reserved price.

- (0-5%)	- Attractive
+ (0-5%)	- Competitive
+/- (6-10%)	- Reasonable
+/- (11-15%)	- Fairly reasonable
+/- (16 and above)	- Unreasonable

#### **(1) YUKAS AND SONS VENTURES**

- i. The corrected tender sum of N355,235,631.25k is high. It is N26, 372,426:50k i.e. 8:00% above the reserved price.
- ii. The completion period of 46 weeks is realistic.
- iii. (a) Although the star unit rates of the tender are consistent, they are higher than the reserved price.  
(b) The contractor has an arithmetic error of N 336,797.50 higher than their tender sum.
- iv All the elemental cost of the tender are higher than the reserved price.

#### **COMMENT**

The contractors corrected bid price is reasonable, it is 8.00% higher than the reserved price. It is recommended for further reconsideration



(2) **GREEN SHED NIG. LTD**

- i. The tender sum of N348,986,204.75k offered by the contractor is high. It is 20,122,581.75 i.e. 6.11% higher than the reserved price.
- ii The completion period of 46 weeks is realistic.
- iii. (a) The star unit rates of the tender are reasonable and consistent  
(b) The contractor has no arithmetic error.
- iv. All the elemental cost of the tender are reasonable except for Wall Finishes and Electrical Installations that are higher.

**COMMENT**

The contractor's tender sum is reasonable, it is 6.11% higher than the reserved price. It is recommended for further reconsideration

(3) **MAHADI SERVICES AND RESOURCES**

- i. The corrected tender sum of N326, 749,743:75 k is reasonable, it is N1, 425, 246: 00 i.e. 0.433% lower than the reserved price.
- ii. The completion period of 42 weeks is realistic.
- iii. (a) The star unit rates of the tender are reasonable and consistent.  
(b) The contractor has an arithmetic error of N 688,215.00 less than their tender sum.
- iv The elemental cost of the tender are also reasonable.

**COMMENT**

The contractors corrected bid price is highly attractive. It is recommended for further reconsideration



(4) **PLENUM SPACE LTD**

- i The corrected tender sum of N385, 132,617:50k is unreasonable. It is N56,269,412:75k i.e 17.115% higher than the reserved price.
- ii. The completion period of 44 weeks is realistic.
- iii. (a) Although the star unit rates of the tender are consistent, they are all higher than the reserved price.  
(b) The contractor has no arithmetic error.
- iv The elemental cost of the tender are higher than the reserved price.

**COMMENT**

Although the completion period of 44 weeks is reasonable and realistic, the contractor's tender figure is too high, it is N 56,269,412.75 higher than the reserved price. It is not recommended for further reconsideration

(5) **TRIPPLE BULLET SERVICES NIG. LTD**

- i. The tender sum of N359, 570,998.95k offered by the contractor is high. It is N30,707,375.20 i.e 9.33% higher than the reserved price.
- ii The completion period of 48 weeks is long.
- iii. (a) Although the starred unit rates of the tender are consistent, they are all higher than the reserved price.  
(b) The contractor has no arithmetic error.
- iv The elemental cost of the tender are higher than the reserved price.

**COMMENT**

The completion period of 48 weeks is high, the tender sum is also high, it is 9.33% higher than the reserved price. The tender sum is uncompetitive, it is recommended for further reconsideration








