SECTION 1 - EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 General

Cosset Consultants was appointed by the National Universities Commission as Procurement auditors to review the procurement activities of the Africa Centre of Excellence for Mycotoxins and Food Safety (ACEMFS), The Federal University of Technology, Minna is one of the 17 Second Africa Higher Education Centres of Excellence for Development Impact (ACE-IMPACT) Projects.

1.2 Aim

The primary aim and objective of this Procurement Process Audit is to review the procurement, contracting and implementation processes and determine the extent to which laws guiding the procurement activities are complied with; and confirm their consistency with the ACE-Impact institutional guidelines and the World Bank general guiding principles. This audit also helps to identify non-compliances and deficiencies in the procurement activities and proffer appropriate corrective measures

1.3 Methodology and Review Procedure

1.3.1 Methodology

The methodology and approach adopted for this post review are in three phases: (i) Inception activities (ii) Field works/activities (iii) Preparation and presentation of audit reports.

Generally, these phases included the determination of scope of assignment and selection of contracts to review. The study and evaluation of the Project/Contract files and other documents. Interactive meetings with the procurement staff. Data collection and analysis; physical site inspections; and the preparation of inception, draft and final procurement audit reports.

Data collection at the ACEMFS was carried out with the use of checklists. Appendix II.

1.3.2 Review Procedure

The audit procurement procedure used at ACEMFS is based on the institutional guidelines and it also considered the levels of compliances with the guidelines and the achievement of the Bank's procurement principles.

However, the procurement process activities of ACEMFS are being implemented in consideration of section 15(1)a & b of the PPA 2007 Act as amended.

1.4 Contract Packages

- i. ACE-MFS has a total contract size of six (6) items in 2023. This is made up of six (6) goods items as shown in the inventory of sampled and reviewed contracts. Appendix 1.
- ii. The appropriate procurement methods to use for every contract based on the threshold were also stated; alongside the methods used by the Centre. Appendix 1.

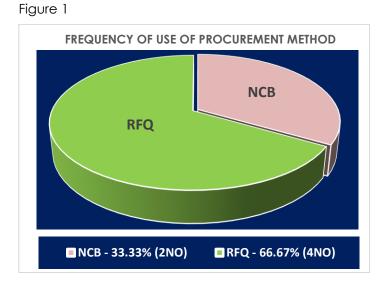

1.4.1 General Procurement Methods

The Request for Quotation (RFQ), that has 66.67% representation with four (4) items. The National Competitive Bidding (NCB) was used two (2) and it is about 3.33% of the procurement as shown on table Figure 1 below. Table 1 above shows the values of the procurement methods.







1.4.2 General Procurement Types

The six (6) procurement were all 100% goods. figure 2. Table 1 above shows the values of the procurement types.

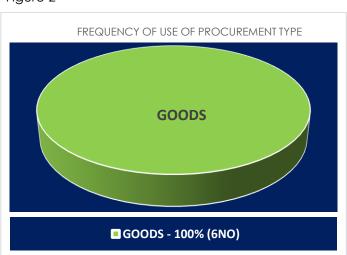

1.4.3 Sample Size

The audit sample size of 66.67% was determined by random sampling of the procured contracts. The selection considered the various procurement methods used, as well as the procurement types. Tables 3 & 4

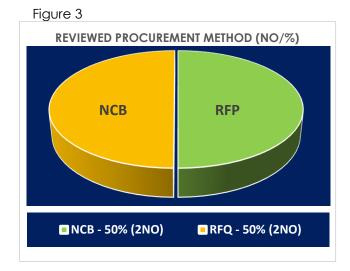

1.4.3.1 Sample Method

The sample size of 66.67% is made up of four (4) contracts. Two (2) were procured using NCB process and it make up 50% of sampled contracts. The other two (2) contracts were procured through RFP and that also represent 50% of the sample size as in figure 3. Table 2 above shows the values of the sample methods.

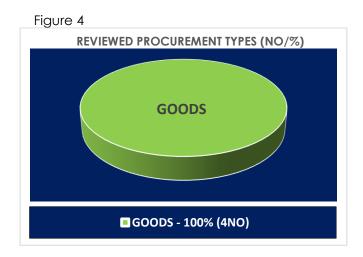






1.4.3.2 Sample Type

Only goods contract type was used by ACEMFS in her 2023 procurement. The four (4) contracts are 100% of the sample type. Figure 4. Table 2 above shows the values of the sample types.



1.5 Findings

- 1. The Public Procurement Act (PPA) 2007 as amended was used by the Centre of Excellence for Mycotoxin and Food Safety (ACE-MFS) in the 2023 procurement activities.
- 2. The contracts procured are in the approved 2023 procurement plan. (Appendix v).





- Six (6) procured contracts were presented as having been carried 3. out by the Centre from January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023.
- 4. The procurement staff have their primary assignment domiciled with the University's central department. They are well qualified for the procurement duties at the Centre.
- 5. All Contracts awarded were approved by the University's appropriate approval authority. The analysis and evaluation of tenders were substantial.
- 6. The supply of procurement documents and information was seamless. The documents were substantially well stored and easily retrieved.
- 7. Standard Bidding Documents (SBD) were used for the procurements.
- 8. Checks for prices competitiveness returned positive results.
- 9. Some payments were not made on time. An instance of such delayed payment was the Supply and Installation of Laboratory Equipment – ACEMFS/NCB/2023/1, where invoice was submitted on July 31, 2023 but payment was made after 137 days on December 15, 2023.
- Withholding Taxes (WHT) and Value Added Taxes (VAT) were seen 10. to have been deducted but remittance to the relevant tax authorities could not be ascertained.
- 11. There was no evidence that the unsuccessful bidders were debriefed.

1.6 Exit meeting

An exit meeting was held where communications on the preliminary findings were discussed with the Centre staff. This presented opportunities for the Centre to clarify issues raised, with explanations on the identified concerns. Some issues were resolved through explanations; with mutual





agreements reached on the disputed areas. The exit meeting data table is as in the attached appendix IV.

1.7 Infractions

There were infractions identified from the reviewed documents of the ACEMFS 2023 procurements activities. Queries on the identified minor infractions were satisfactorily responded to by the Centre during the exit meeting. The explanations by ACEMFS were satisfactory on the identified issues and so, there were no significant infractions.

1.8 Procurement Process and Activities Assessment

The team considered the performance of the general procurement processes and activities to determine the level of exposure to perceived infractions and inconsistencies. The procurement activities were categorized into low, medium and high risks with percentages ranges of 0-39.99%, 40-59.99% and 60-100% respectively. Analysis of the specific contracts identified issues were carried out through the assessment matrix as shown with appendix iii, before the level of risks were finally determined and stated.

The performances of the procurement processes were put to test and categorized as "Poor" at a range of 0 - 49.99%; "Fair" at 50 - 69.99% and "Good" at 70 – 100%.

Overall, the ACEMFS is adjudged to have achieved an aggregate "MEDIUM" procurement risk grading and a "FAIR" procurement efficiency/performance rating.

1.9 **Rating and Classification**

The audit review opinion is classified and rated as shown on table 5 below

The procurement activities of ACE-Impact projects, the ACE-MFS, Federal University of Technology, Minna NEED IMPROVEMENT. The opinion is based on consideration of compliances to the guidelines, the Public Procurement Act 2007 and the WB general procurement principles; where strongly required as shown in table 6. ACE-MFS is considered to have achieved sixty-five percentage (65%) mark.

1.11 Recommendations

- A good procurement practice ensures that payments are not delayed. A situation where payment was made 137 days after invoice was submitted should not be accepted and whatever caused it must be avoided.
- 2. Procurement processes must be documented properly with timeline for every activity/process. For instance, the RFQs issued to the bidders were not sighted. The Centre's claim that they were sent through e-mail was not enough.
- 4. It is advised that unsuccessful bidders should always be debriefed; even when they do not request that. This creates more awareness to the bidder about his lapses and would help to create healthier procurement environment through improved levels of competition.
- 5. Procurement training is very important considering the role procurement plays in the economy of a nation or organization. Continuous procurement training for staff of the Centre will improve the qualities of deliveries at every stage of the programme.

SECTION 2 - INTRODUCTION

2.1 BACKGROUND

Due to the need to promote regional specialization amongst Universities in the West and Central Africa sub-region within disciplines that address particular common regional challenges, the Africa Center of Excellence (ACE) Project aims at strengthening the capacities of these Universities to enable them deliver high quality training and applied research.

1. Africa Centre of Excellence (ACE 1) Project

The Africa Centre of Excellence (ACE 1) project was instituted in 2013 by the Government of Nigerian, Ghana, Benin Republic, Togo, Burkina Faso, Cameroun and Senegal with support from the World Bank.

The Federal Government of Nigeria (FGN) entered into a credit agreement (Credit Number 5415-NG) after securing US\$70.0 million with the International Development Agency (IDA) of the World Bank (WB) to finance the ACEs project in 10 Nigerian Universities.

2. The Second Africa Higher Education Centres of Excellence for Development Impact (ACE- Impact) Project

The Second Africa Higher Education Centres of Excellence for Development Impact (ACE- Impact) Projects resulted from the successes achieved with the ACE 1. ACE-Impact project has 43 Centres in the Africa sub-region, with 17 of them being run by Nigeria Universities.

ACE-Impact project (Credit Number 6510-NG) was designed to inject \$115 million to the Nigeria University System (NUS).

2.2. THE AFRICA CENTER OF EXCELLENCE FOR MYCOTOXIN AND FOOD SAFETY, (ACE-MFS,) FEDERAL UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY, MINNA.

ACE-MFS's goal is "to be a global food safety training and research authority in order to realize sustainable and secure health for humanity".

The Centre's noted that "the creation of the Africa Center of Excellence for Mycotoxin and Food Safety will create learning opportunities and research results to address Africa's shortage of expertise and applicable solutions to ensure a safe, controlled and sufficient food supply that will support economic growth and public health".

2.3 NATIONAL UNIVERSITIES COMMISSION (NUC)

The **National Universities Commission (NUC)** of Nigeria is a parastatal under the Federal Ministry of Education (FME). It was established in 1962 as an advisory agency in the Cabinet Office and became a statutory body in 1974. NUC is a regulatory agency acting as a catalyst for positive change and innovation for the delivery of quality University education in Nigeria.

The **NUC** aims to: achieve a stable and crisis-free University System; upgrade and maintain physical facilities in the Nigerian University System for delivery of quality university education and match university graduate output with national manpower needs; work with Nigerian Universities to achieve full accreditation status for at least 80% of the academic programmes; foster partnership between the Nigerian University System and the private sector.

The National Coordination of the ACE-Impact projects is domiciled at the National Universities Commission (NUC). It is responsible for the National Project facilitation, training, and supervision in fiduciary aspects as well as national Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) and minor Technical Assistance (TA) in Nigeria.

2.4 WORLD BANK PROCUREMENT GUIDELINE

The WB guideline has set rules guiding the procurement processes to be followed for procurement of good, works, consulting and non-consulting services being financed with loans from the WB. It covers the consideration of the WB core procurement principles in every contract.

Notwithstanding the established procurement guidelines, the FG/NUC and the WB have agreed to allow the ACE-Impact Centres to use the various institutions guidelines for the implementation of the projects.

2.5 PUBLIC PROCUREMENT ACT (PPA) 2007

The Public Procurement Act 2007 as amended guides all procurement activities of the Ministries Departments and Agencies (MDAs) in Nigeria. The PPA 2007 is regulated by the Bureau of Public Procurement (BPP). One of BPP's functions is to regulate and ensure the reduction of infractions, weaknesses and non-compliances aimed at reducing corruption in public procurement. It also aims to ensure value for money, economy, transparency, competition, fairness, integrity and accountability in public procurement activities; improved professionalism and enhanced service delivery.

The PPA Act 2007 as amended provides the basic framework for the award and execution of contracts in Nigeria and promotes freedom of information that mandates all unclassified procurement records to be made available to appropriate public for inspection.

2.6 PROCUREMENT PROCESS AUDIT OF ACE-IMPACT PROJECTS

The purpose of the Procurement Audit of ACE-Impact is to study, verify, interpret, and critically analyze all data, documents and Procurement statement collected/received and form true, fair and independent opinion on the Procurement Statements of the Procurement operation of ACE (Nigeria) for the period under review and to report findings to the National Universities Commission (NUC).

2.7 OBJECTIVES OF THE ACE-IMPACT PROJECT PROCUREMENT PROCESS AUDIT

This Procurement Audit is to identify and report on negligence in procurement management operations and decisions. It is also structured to bring to light all fraudulent acts, weaknesses, deficiencies and non-compliances that negatively affect procurement activities and recommend deterrents and corrective actions to ensure improved processes.

The Procurement audit gave objective assessments of the procedures specified in the Credit Agreement and determine the levels of compliances with institutional guidelines with respect to the considerations of the World Bank procurement guiding principles.

2.8 ENGAGEMENT OF COSSET CONSULTANTS

The NUC engaged Cosset Consultants to carry out post review of procurement activities of the 17 ACE-Impact Centres in fourteen (14) Nigeria Universities, including the ACE-MFS, Federal University of Technology, Minna, Niger State, Nigeria.

2.9 METHODOLOGY

- 1. The methodology adopted for this assignment is generally concerned with investigations, inquiry, assertions, reasoning and research. The approach is objective, verifiable, and quantifiable. Interactions and interviews were held with officers of ACE-MFS that were involved in the various stages of the procurement process/activities. The opinions and clarifications from the ACE-MFS staff were considered and addressed in the report.
- 2. Contract data forms were used to collect the information that were analyzed. The contents of the form include information on general contracts, procurements and contracting, costs, time, contract administration, disbursement and deliverables. The documents made available to the consultant from which the data were collected include:
- (i) Procurement Plan, (ii) Solicitation documents used before award.
- (iii) Contract files, (iv) Payment Vouchers.

- 3. Visits to selected project site were undertaken to determine the quality of materials and labour deployed to the works by the contractor. It also helps to determine the level of supervision from the ACE-MFS procurement staff.
- 4. This data analyzed enabled the determination of the following critical success factors;
 - 1) compliances with the provisions of the World Bank Procurement Guidelines.
 - 2) Compliances with the provisions of the Public Procurement Act 2007 (examine the Management Control Framework in place to monitor procurement and contracting activities within ACE-MFS PIU).
 - 3) Compliances with the use of standard bidding documents (examine procurement documents and contracts files issued between the stipulated periods).
 - 4) Compliances with the Code of Conduct for Public Officers involved in Procurement (review the processes undertaken by personnel of the ACE-MFS Project who are directly involved in procurement and contracting activities).
 - 5) Optimized commercial performance and value for money (review related procurement procedures, guidelines and processes and determine the level to which value for money was achieved).
- 5. Exit meeting was held with the procurement staff of the Centre. The observed key weaknesses and non-compliances were brought to their notice. The explanation given by the Centre staff are considered in the report.
- 6. The personnel interacted with at the ACE-MFS during the field works were:
 - Center Leader
 - 2) Accountant
 - 3) Internal Auditor
 - 4) Procurement Officer.

SECTION 3 – SCOPE AND REVIEW SAMPLES

3.1 **AUDIT SCOPE**

The procurement audit covers the review of all the procurement transactions, limited to the samples selected for audit, including prices reviews and compares of similar rates as at the time of award. Selected project site and inspection of procured goods, works and services are expected to be taken into consideration. The scope incudes determining the following:

- Whether the procurement statements from the ACE-MFS procurement unit conform to accepted procurement principles in accordance with the NUC/WB guidelines.
- 2. Whether they fairly represent the financial position of the ACE-MFS activities.
- 3. Whether the result of operations for a given period are accurately represented.
- 4. Whether the procurement statements have been altered.

3.2 **REVIEW SAMPLE**

During the field work, ACE-MFS presented their procurement plan with a list of six (6) procured contracts. All were completed.

Four (4) procured contracts were selected for review. The selection was 66.67% of the procured items and amount to about 88.30% of the value of procured contracts.

The data sourced from documents and information ACEMFS provided formed the basis for the assessment and decisions on the reviewed samples size.

This audit review was based on information extracted from the Center's Procurement Plan, as well as other documents made available to the Consultant by the ACE-MFS staff. There were also interviews and interactions with key personnel. The value of the six (6) contracts was N155,799,308.70

SECTION 4 - SPECIFIC CONTRACTS/PROJECTS DETAILS

4.1 PROCUREMENT AND INSTALLATION OF LABORATORY EQUIPMENT ACEMFS LOT 1

4.1.1 Introduction

Seven (7) bidders responded to the advertisement in the National Express Newspaper and the Awareness Times Newspaper, both of Monday June 12, 2023. The bids were opened at the close of bids submission date on July 10, 2023 in the presence of the University's Tenders Board, ACEMFS representative, Professional bodies, Consultants and the bidders' representatives. Bids evaluation report was concluded in July, 2023 and through a notice dated July 31, 2023, the contract was awarded to Messrs Katchey Company Limited, in the sum of Forty-Nine Million, Six Hundred and Nine Thousand, Five Hundred and Nine Naira, Eighty-seven kobo (N49,609,509.87). This is an equivalent of USD 62,504.119 at N793.70/\$. This is 1.04% of the Bank financing. Messrs Katchey Company Limited offered the lowest responsive bid. The acceptance of the offer is dated August 6, 2023.

4.1.2 Observations/ Findings

In line with the NCB procedure, the following are the observations in the procurement process leading to the award of this contract.

4.1.2.1 Procurement Planning

This contract is in the approved 2023 procurement plan.

4.1.2.2 Advertisement

The contract was advertised in the National Express Newspaper and the Awareness Times Newspaper, both of Monday June 12, 2023. None was placed in the Federal Tenders' Journal.

4.1.2.3 Pre/Post Qualification

The contract is not within the threshold for prequalification.

4.1.2.4 Competition

There was not enough competition due to the nature, size and type of medium used to solicit for the auotations.

4.1.2.5 Bid Opening

The bids were opened publicly in the presence of the Procurement Committee and some independent observers.

4.1.2.6 Bidding Documents

Standard bidding documents were used.

4.1.2.7 Evaluation of Bids/ Proposals

The bids were evaluated and analysed by the bid evaluation committee. There was minute of meeting where the approval was given by the University Tenders Board before award letter was issued to the successful bidder.

4.1.2.8 Award of Contract

Notification of award was issued to Messrs Katchey Company Limited of No. 26 Odanye Close, Harmony Enclave Estate, Adeniyi Jones, Ikeja Lagos; with an award letter dated July 31, 2023. Acceptance was made on August 6, 2023.

4.1.2.9 Contract Documents

The contract documents were well packaged and they include the quotation, award letter, acceptance letter and the contract agreement that was executed on August 22, 2023, though it was signed after July 31, 2023 when the goods were delivered.

4.1.2.10 Procurement Duration

The procurement processes leading up to the signing of contract was completed in forty-one (41) days. This is within limit.

4.1.2.11 Contract Implementation

The post process procurement of the items is satisfactory.

4.1.2.12 Payments

A gross payment of N49,609,509.87 was made to the Supplier on December 15, 2023 through PV/2023/FUTM -1/000000370. The invoice was raised on July 31, 2023. The payment was made 137 days after the invoice was submitted.

4.1.2.13 Physical Inspection

The team visited the location of the goods and they were physically seen to be in good conditions. Test performances were not carried out.

4.1.3 Recommendation

- 1. Delay in payment should be avoided to mitigate against possible claims and litigations.
- 2. ACEMFS should be mindful and always ensure that the rules of procurement process are complied with.
- 3. Procurement training should be a regular exercise because it enables dynamic approach that enhance seamless procurement process and project management.

4.1.4 Conclusion

4.2. PROCUREMENT AND INSTALLATION OF LABORATORY FURNITURE - ACEMFS/NCB/2023/1(LOT 2)

4.2.1 Introduction

This was procured using NCB. The advertisements were place on Monday June 12, 2023 in the National Express Newspaper and in the Awareness Times Newspaper, soliciting for bids. Seven (7) bidders responded. The bids were opened at the close of bids submission date on July 10, 2023 in the presence of the University's Tenders Board, ACEMFS representative, Professional bodies, Consultants and the bidders' representatives. Bids evaluation report was concluded in July, 2023. The award letter dated July 31, 2023 was issued to the lowest bidder, Messrs Fonsots Global Services Ltd of Suite D1, Area 11 Shopping Complex Garki, Abuja, in the sum of Forty-eight Million Nine Hundred and Seventy Thousand and Sixty-four Naira, Thirty-three kobo (N48,970,064.33). This is an equivalent of USD 61,698.46 at N793.70/\$ and it is 1.04% of the Bank financing. The acceptance of offer was dated August 7, 2023. Agreement was signed on August 23, 2023 while the store received the item on November 27, 2023.

4.2.2 Observations/ Findings

In line with the NCB procedure, the following are the observations in the procurement process leading to the award of this contract.

4.2.2.1 Procurement Planning

This contract is in the approved 2023 procurement plan.

4.2.2.2 Advertisement

The contract was advertised in the National Express Newspaper and the Awareness Times Newspaper, both of Monday June 12, 2023. None was placed in the Federal Tenders' Journal.

4.2.2.3 Pre/Post Qualification

The contract is not within the threshold for prequalification.

4.2.2.4 Competition

Competition was not substantial due to the nature, size and type of medium used to solicit for the quotations.

4.2.2.5 Bid Opening

The bids were opened publicly in the presence of the University's Management board, Procurement Committee and some independent observers.

4.2.2.6 Bidding Documents

Standard bidding documents were used for the procurement.

4.2.2.7 Evaluation of Bids/ Proposals

The bids were evaluated and analysed by the bid evaluation committee. There was minute of meeting where the approval was given by the University Tenders Board before award letter was issued to the successful bidder.

4.2.2.8 Award of Contract

Notification of award was issued to Messrs Fonsots Global Services Ltd of Suite D1, Area 11 Shopping Complex Garki, Abuja, with an award letter dated July 31, 2023. Acceptance was made on August 7, 2023.

4.2.2.9 Contract Documents

The contract documents were well packaged and they include the quotation, award letter, acceptance letter and the contract agreement that was executed on August 23, 2023. The goods were received at the store through the store receipt note dated November 27, 2023.

4.2.2.10 Procurement Duration

The procurement processes leading up to the signing of contract was completed in forty-two (42) days. This is within limit.

4.2.2.11 Contract Implementation

The procurement, post award of the contract was satisfactory.

4.2.2.12 Payments

A gross payment of N48,970,064.33was made to the Supplier on December 15, 2023 through PV/2023/FUTM -1/000000370. The invoice was raised on November 27, 2023. The payment was made 18 days after the invoice was submitted. This is commendable.

4.2.2.13 Physical Inspection

The team visited the location of the goods and they were physically seen to be in good conditions. Test performances were not carried out.

4.2.3 Recommendation

- 1. ACEMFS should be mindful and always ensure that the rules of procurement process are complied with.
- 2. Procurement training should be a regular exercise because it enables dynamic approach that enhance seamless procurement process and project management.

4.2.4 Conclusion

The Centre should always ensure that she complies with guidelines as stated in the Terms of Reference (TOR) and other requirements. The primary attribute of good procurement starts with strives to achieve the general procurement principles.

4.3. PROCUREMENT OF CLASSROOM FURNITURE AND EQUIPMENT FOR ACEMFS FUT MINNA (FUTM/ACEMFS/GDS/NS/2023/04)

4.3.1 Introduction

The Centre invited five (5) contractors to bid for the contract. They include Messrs. Kezmek International Limited, MESSRS Torminent Global LTD, messrs Erotech Engineering Services LTD, Messrs Arcisoph LTD, and Messrs Daciotech. They all responded and submitted their quotations. Bid evaluation was carried out and all necessary approvals were issued accordingly. The contract was awarded to MESSRS KEZMEK INTERNATIONAL LIMITED with an award letter dated October 3, 2023. The contract award amount was Nineteen Million, and seventy thousand, five hundred- and twenty-one-naira, fifty kobo (N19,070,521.50). This is about USD 23,399.41 at N815/\$ and it is equivalent to 0.38% of the Bank Financing. It would be noted that the date of invitation for bid and the date of submission were not sighted.

4.3.2 Observations/ Findings

In line with the RFQ procedure, the following are the major observations in the procurement process.

4.3.2.1 Procurement Planning

This contract is in the 2023 procurement plan.

4.3.2.2 Advertisement

It does not require advertisement in National Newspapers and the Federal Tenders' Journal. However, it was not placed on the Centre's notice board or the website.

4.3.2.3 Pre/Post Qualification

Pre-Qualification exercise does not apply to this procurement. The value is not within the threshold for that.

4.3.2.4 Competition

There was considerable prices competitiveness with the process.

4.3.2.5 Bid Opening

The bids were opened but the presence of bidders and independent observers could not be ascertained.

4.3.2.6 Bidding Documents

Standard bidding documents were used for the procurement.

4.3.2.7 Evaluation of Bids/ Proposals

The bids were evaluated and analysed by the procurement committee. Approval was made by the University's Tenders Board before award letter was issued.

4.3.2.8 Award of Contract

The award was made to the best and lowest responsive bidder. Notification of award letter is dated October 3, 2023.

4.3.2.9 Contract Documents

The Standard Bidding Document, the quotations, the award later, acceptance letter and signed contract agreement constitute the contract documents.

4.3.2.10 Procurement Duration

The procurement process duration of 36 days, up to the signing of the Contract Agreement is commendable.

4.3.2.11 Contract Implementation

The contract implementation was good considering the period within which the items were supplied to the Centre.

4.3.2.12 Payments

The net amount of N16,675,618.00 was paid to the contractor using different payment vouchers and captured as follows

 PV/2023/FUTM-1/000000283 of October 10, 2023,

- 4. N363,263.00 Being Purchase of Office Equipment PV/2023/FUTM-1/000000284 of October 10, 2023,
- N7,123,649.00 Payment for the Purchase of Lecture Hall/Auditorium Seats - PV/2023/FUTM-1/ACEMFS -PV/2023/FUTM-1/000000314 of October 23, 2023,
- N499,948.40 Being Purchase of Projector for ACEMFS PV/2023/FUTM-1/000000315 of October 23, 2023,
- N350,949.00 Being Purchase of Scanner and Printer For ACEMFS
 PV/2023/FUTM-1/000000316 of October 23, 2023 and

4.3.2.13 Physical Inspection

The audit team made physical inspection of the materials procured. Some are shown in the attached pictures. Appendix vii.

4.3.3 Recommendation

- 1. Procurement processes must be documented properly with timeline for every activity/process. For instance, the RFQs issued to the bidders were not sighted. The Centre's claim that they were sent through e-mail is not enough coupled with the fact that evidence of that was not retrieved and shown to the audit team.
- 2. Procurement training should be a regular exercise because it enables dynamic approach that enhance seamless procurement process and project management.

4.3.4 Conclusion

The Centre should always ensure that she complies with derivatives as stated in the Terms of Reference (TOR) and other requirements. The primary attribute of good procurement starts with complying with the procurement rules guidelines.

4.4 PROCUREMENT AND INSTALLATION OF 25KVA HYBRID INVERTER WITH 24 TUBULAR BATTERIES FOR ACEMFS

4.4.1 Introduction

The 25kva Hybrid Inverter with 24 Tubular Batteries was procured using Request for Quotation (RFQ). This was necessitated to support the operation of the analytical equipment. In effect, this contract is not in the 2023 procurement plan of the Centre. The Centre informed the team that she issued quotations to five (5) bidders.

The five (5) bidders were Messrs. MNKCK Global Links, Messrs SKO Electricals, Messrs Jajilite Greenpower Solutions, Messrs Erotech Engineering Services Ltd, and Messrs Tormiinent Global Ltd). Based on the bid evaluation and analysis, MESSRS MNKCK was selected by the procurement committee as the lowest and best responsive and made recommendation for award that was approved by the University Tenders Board. The notification of award of contract to Messrs MNKCK was through the letter dated October 3, 2023, in the sum of Nineteen Million Nine Hundred and Seventy-three thousand Five Hundred Naira (N19,973,500.00). This is about USD 24,507.36 at N815/\$ and it is equivalent to 0.40% of the Bank Financing. The contract was completed on October 17, 2023.

4.4.2 Observations/ Findings

The review showed the following observation regarding the process.

4.4.2.1 Procurement Planning

This contract is the 2023 procurement plan as a support for the Analytical Equipment.

4.4.2.2 Advertisement

Advertisement in National Newspapers and the Federal Tenders' Journal does not apply because of the threshold. However, it was not placed on the Centre's notice board or the website.

4.4.2.3 Pre/Post Qualification

Pre-Qualification exercise does not apply to this procurement.

4.4.2.4 Competition

There was considerable price competitiveness with the process.

4.4.2.5 Bid Opening

The bids were opened but the presence of bidders and independent observers could not be ascertained because no bid return sheet was sighted.

4.4.2.6 Bidding Documents

Standard bidding documents were used for the procurement.

4.4.2.7 Evaluation of Bids/ Proposals

The bids were evaluated and analysed by the procurement committee. Approval was made by the University's Tenders Board before award letter was issued.

4.4.2.8 Award of Contract

The award was made to the best and lowest responsive bidder. Notification of award letter is dated October 3, 2023. The date of the contract completion is October 17, 2023 while the date of contract Agreement is October 26, 2023; which suggests that the contract was signed after it has been completed.

4.4.2.9 Contract Documents

The Standard Bidding Document, the quotations, the award later, acceptance letter and signed contract agreement constitute the contract documents. The documents were well packaged and presented.

4.4.2.10 Procurement Duration

The procurement duration was completed in 38 days and this is tolerable for RFQ procurement method.

4.4.2.11 Contract Implementation

The contract implementation was good considering the period within which the items were supplied to the Centre.

4.4.2.12 Payments

The net amount of N17,465,200.00 was paid twice as follows:

- N8,732,600.00 Payment for The Supply and Installation of Hybrid Inverter and Others – PV/2023/FUTM-1/000000286 of October 10, 2023 and
- 2. N8,732,600.00 Payment for the Supply and Installation of Hybrid Inverters– PV/2023/FUTM-1/000000320 of October 23, 2023.

4.4.2.13 Physical Inspection

The audit team made physical inspection of the materials procured. Some are shown in the attached pictures. Appendix vii.

4.4.3 Recommendation

- Based on the audit process field work at the ACEMFS, the Centre should be more circumspect while receiving and evaluating submissions from the bidders.
- Records of bid opening process, including bid return sheets should always be presented to confirm the level of transparency and fairness of the process.
- 3. Contracts should be carried out in the correct order to show transparency.
- 4. Ensure that dates are appropriately written on all the documents were necessary to show a timeline for procurement process.
- Ensure that the letter of completion be issued to the contractor as evidence that he/she is no longer bounded by the conditions of contract.

4.4.4 Conclusion

The Center should keep improving by adhering strictly to the rules and regulations guiding the public procurement management.

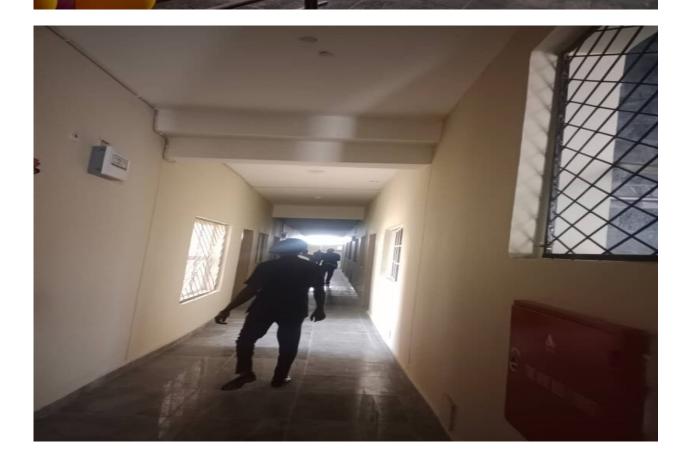

3.1 TERMS OF REFERENCE

- Withdrawals from the Loan/Credit Agreement (date and value);
- Protests from Bidders/Contractors;
- Reasons for Slow Progress of Completion;
- Delays in Payments, Imports, Customs, etc. if any;

- List of deliverables and completion (date, description, quantity, location of goods or works);
- Contractual Disputes and their Resolution;
